Becoming an IN-HOME HERO

What will I do?

You'll help animals outside of the shelter environment who are underage, sick, or under-socialized become healthy and ready for adoption.

You'll take these animals to your home and care for them. **Food and medical care will be provided to you by KHS.**

How long will I have my foster pet?

Average stay is two weeks but can vary depending on the animal's needs.

How do I know if I qualify?

You must attend two training classes and complete the license application for the Kansas Animal Health Department (\$10).

You must have the time and ability to work with your foster animal(s).

If you have pets, they should be spayed/neutered and fully vaccinated. It is ideal if you have a room or space in your home where the foster animals can be separated from your own pets when necessary.

Your involvement in our program will prepare KHS animals like Cynthia for a full and healthy life!

Your participation in the program can save lives and create inspiring stories like this:

Perdita, or Perdi for short, arrived at KHS at a very young age in dire need of help. A callus was beginning to form in her front, left shoulder, making it difficult for her to walk. Our staff and volunteers made every effort to clear the infection, but decided amputation would be the better option for her.



The surgery went extremely well, but there was simply no space at the shelter to keep a kitten during a recovery that would take several weeks.



This is where a foster home makes the difference - somebody was willing to take the kitten so that she could recover in a quiet, caring home.

Perdita's story has a happy ending! She recovered from her surgery and enjoys running and tumbling with her siblings. And best of all - she was adopted by a loving family that will continue to care for her throughout her long, happy life.
